

## Disable Browser Auto-Fill and Auto-Complete

This article provides OPS-COM administrators with instructions to disable browser auto-fill and auto-complete features. Disabling these settings prevents browsers from automatically populating form fields with incorrect data, which ensures data integrity when managing user profiles and other sensitive information within the system.

### Setup and Configuration

To ensure accurate data entry, follow the steps below corresponding to your specific web browser.

Some browser plug-ins, such as password managers, may also act as auto-fill utilities and cause similar issues. If disabling the browser's native auto-fill does not resolve the issue, review your installed plug-ins and **disable** or **configure** them to exclude the OPS-COM domain as needed.

### Internet Explorer

1. Click the **Tools** menu icon.
2. Select **Internet Options** and navigate to the **Content** tab.
3. Under **Auto Complete**, click **Settings**.
4. Uncheck **Forms** and **User Names and Passwords on Forms**.

### Microsoft Edge

1. Open **Edge** and click the **More** icon (three dots) at the top right.

2. Go to **Settings** and scroll to **Advanced Settings**.
3. Locate **Save Form Entries** and toggle the setting to **off**.

## Chrome

1. Open **Chrome**.
2. Click **More** and select **Settings** at the top right.
3. Scroll to the bottom and click **Show advanced settings**.
4. Under **Passwords and forms**, uncheck **Enable Autofill to fill out web forms in a single click**.

## Firefox

1. Open **Firefox**.
2. Type **about:config** in the address bar and press **Enter**.
3. Click **I'll be careful, I promise**.
4. Search for **dom.forms.requestAutocomplete** and double-click the entry to set its value to **False**.

## Safari

1. Open **Safari** and go to **Preferences**.
2. Click **AutoFill**.
3. Deselect all categories of information you do not want Safari to auto-fill.
4. Click **Edit** next to a specific category if you need to edit or delete existing saved information.

## Best Practices and Considerations

- **Test after configuration:** Always save your changes and refresh the system to confirm that the auto-fill issue is resolved.

- **Security Awareness:** If you are using a shared workstation, be aware that disabling auto-fill is a critical step in maintaining data privacy and preventing unauthorized access to saved credentials.
